

STUDENT SENATE MINUTES
June 18th, 2019

The Senate President called the Senate meeting to order at 7:01pm and announced that the meeting may be filmed or audio recorded and may be available to the public. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

PUBLIC DEBATE:

- Joe Andreoli:
 - After one whole month of uncertainty, “I am not” one of the Graduate Senator.
 - “When I was your age,” Andreoli would be upset with this news.
 - But he is not “your age.”
 - We are now, at the end of Summer A, are having the first full meeting.
 - Asks senators to look at the Facebook livestreams for the Replacement and Agenda Committee Meetings put together by Zachariah Chou.
 - Commends the actions and behavior of Minority Party Leader Grabowski and Coalition Leader Wilson during the Replacement and Agenda Committee meetings.
 - They respect the right that all senators had the right to choose their replacement senators for summer.
 - Nicole Smith and Collin Solomon were taken away their seats.
 - “Your duty is the values we say we care about” in so many different initiatives.
 - Will continue to apply to open senate seats when they are made available.
 - If anyone is unhappy with SG, “Don’t give up.”
 - “Let their actions fuel you.”
- Senator Greenwald:
 - Serves as a District B senator.
 - Thanks the senate for welcoming him into the chamber.
 - Working with passionate leaders is all he could ask for.
 - Being raised as an Asian-American was considered a blessing to Senator Greenwald.
 - Learned that the University of Florida has the largest Jewish population on a college campus.
 - The Jewish college experience over the years calls for the establishment of a Jewish Caucus on campus.
 - Will be sending out a form through the listserv for those interested in joining this caucus.
 - If anyone has questions, please speak to Senator Greenwald.
- Collin Solomon:
 - As time goes on, it seems less likely to be called a senator.
 - Mentions it is not many of the senators’ faults. It is only a select few of them.

- Introduces himself to the new faces.
- Does not have a home in Michigan anymore, but rather in Gainesville.
 - Wanted to impact this home by participating in Student Government.
- Mentions the initiatives he has worked on, including legislation drafted, and attending committee meetings.
- Works over 40 hours a week, but when he is free, he spends lots of time to see what can be done in the student body.
- A reason why he was not approved by the joint committee was because of not coming with an extended idea sheet.
 - Comes into his next interview with this sheet, and says that he was never given a good reason why he was not approved the next time around.
- Asks the chamber to brainstorm why he was not approved as a senator.
- “Do your job. Someone needs to.”
- Nicole Smith:
 - Shows a clip from this past week’s Replacement and Agenda Committee Meeting.
- Senator Bindi:
 - Thanks Smith for sharing the clip of the Replacement and Agenda Committee Meeting.
 - Forgets how powerful that clip was.
 - Will be objecting because of Cameron Coakes being a fellow Florida Cicerone with Senator Bindi.
 - Notes the bond that he has with fellow Cicerones.
 - Claims Senator Pearson, realizing he was running out of time before the building closes, pushed through Sophomore and Yulee Senator nominations, despite not discussing the names of the senators.
 - “Just because you claim to be independent, does not mean that you actually are.”
- Senator Ragan:
 - Here to talk on behalf of a current a member of the Asian-Pacific American Task Force.
 - Will be working with those in Student Government, in hopes of drafting legislation to benefit Asian-American Students.
 - There will be a letter drive.
 - A unity letter will also be drafted.
 - This will be Tuesday, July 2nd from 10:00-2:00pm
 - The letter drive will be open from July 2nd-July 9th.
 - Our efforts show that there is support of these organizations form students and staff, and the registration is there.
 - Asks to support the upcoming resolution and letter drive.
 - Provides a mission statement by the Asian-Pacific American Task Force.
 - Some issues to be addressed include the __ minor, and currently only one of these classes have been offered in the past few years, and they do not qualify for general education credit.
 - After constant advocacy, Korean is now being taught at UF.
- Senator Amrose:
 - Here to speak on Student Senate Bill 2019-1067 on behalf of the Inspire Party.
 - Will be attempting to fail the code revisions.
 - The main theme of the revisions is that there is much less room for discretion from Student Government to decide funding for organizations.
 - Many executive board members of organizations complained on things such as the loss of umbrella organization structures, widespread belief that concerns are not being heard, and others.
 - Judging from organization reactions, the committee has seemed to do a fine job in fielding concerns.

- Many students have found ways around these changes.
 - The code revisions must be called out for its inclusivity.
 - Worked with Chairman Brown on many amendments to the legislation.
 - Many concerns of organizations remained unheard, despite the changes made.
- Senator Ortiz:
 - Don't typically stands here to talk about politics.
 - Has comments to make about his own actions.
 - Senator Ortiz objected to the Supreme Court nominees.
 - Believes the now appointed Justices are very qualified.
 - Wants to also address the Senate that he will vote in favor of the nominee of the Yulee Area Senator by the Replacement and Agenda Committee.
 - Does not want to punish the applicant for something out of their control.
 - Hopefully it will weigh on "your decision here."
 - Wants to comment on what has been happening lately in the Replacement and Agenda Committee.
 - Does not resonate with corruption.
 - However, wants to applaud both sides of the argument for the way they handled the situation.
 - Does not want to comment on whether or not there is corruption in the Senate.
- Senator Lima:
 - Tonight, we have the task of confirming Senators who will serve in the best interest of the student body.
 - Once again, the Replacement and Agenda Committee has "aired" on this opportunity.
 - Saw current and former members of Impact Party vote "along party lines."
 - Believes the nominees for Sophomore and Yulee Senators were recommended swiftly and carelessly.
 - These instances appear to be blatantly partisan efforts.
 - Believes the applicants approved were unqualified.
 - Asks senators to think if these applicants are qualified, or "if they are qualified."
- Coalition Leader Wilson:
 - Is able to have a seat at the table of the Replacement and Agenda Committee.
 - Commends the students who applied for all the seats that were reviewed.
 - The standout Graduate Senator Applicant was Joe Andreoli.
 - When interviewing people, you not only look at a resume, but you look at the person's initiative.
 - Andreoli is qualified, especially if he has served as a Graduate Senator.
 - Notes that the only Graduate Senators on the committee were ignored.
 - Mentions that the Majority Party Leader went to push applicants through when a Reitz employee told the committee to leave, instead of motioning to adjourn.
- Minority Party Leader Grabowski:
 - Provides a PowerPoint Presentation regarding what exactly happened at this past Replacement and Agenda Committee Meeting.
- Chairman Brown:
 - Wants to discuss Student Senate Bill 2019-1067: 800 Code Revisions
 - Explains the urgency of this bill so that student organizations can receive funding on July 1st.
 - Goes through the entirety of amendments made by Chairman Brown and Senator Amrose.
 - Appreciates the time spent with both big and small organizations over this budgeting process.
 - A lot of these decisions were made on behalf of many different organizations.

- Would love to speak with anyone organization on this.
- Senator Gant:
 - Speaking on behalf of Inspire as to why Kyra Ducoat should not be appointed as a Permanent Senator for District D.
 - Claims Ducoat has never attended meetings and participated in initiatives before being appointed.
 - Notes that Collin Solomon has not been appointed, despite being so involved in Student Government and listening to criticism.

AMENDMENTS TO THE AGENDA:

- Chairman Brown moves to move the First Reading of Student Senate Bill 2019-1067: 800 Code Revisions to after student body officer reports by unanimous consent.
- Chairman Brown moves to move the First Reading of Student Senate Bill 2019-1061 Fiscal Year 19-20 Amended A&S Fee Budget to after student body officer reports by unanimous consent.

STUDENT BODY OFFICER REPORTS

- There were none.

FIRST READING:

Student Senate Bill 2019-1067: 800 Code Revisions

Chairman Brown moves to adopt the proposed amendments to Student Senate Bill 2019-1067: 800 Code Revision by unanimous consent. Approved.

- Wants to eliminate the difficulty for smaller organizations to receive funding on their own term.
- Wanted to read the codes to describe the model of budgeting for any organization members watching the meeting.
 - Changes include: All organizations, regardless of size, purpose, etc. will be going to the Allocations committee, with a common cap of funding for every organization, and the operational budget will now be an annual thing.
- Speaks on increasing caps, and thanks the many organizations who advocated for changes to these caps.
- Mentioned last meeting: notes that “lobbying” will no longer be funded. The line is now being dissolved.

Five minutes of non-debatable technical questions

- Senator Ortiz: Will decisions on these codes be able to be reported to the Supreme Court?
- Chairman Brown: I am unsure.
- Senator White: Where is something like the Graduate Student Council being represented in these changes?
- Chairman: This is simply a line carved out of for Graduate Student Council. This is outlined in the proposed budget from last week, as this subcommittee has its own line now.
- Senator Garner: How will this affect sub-organizations?
- Chairman Brown: This will allow for smaller organizations can go straight to the committee for funding. This will open many more financial opportunities under this model. Dispels the concern

of sub-organizations straying from large ones, as there are more things than financial reasons that tie these organizations.

- Senator Amrose: Do you know what would happen if organizations reach funding caps abnormally quick?
- Chairman: The caps will be based on organizations expenditure in previous years. If this is the case, we can address this in the next budget season.
- Senator Jesurajan: Can you go over the changes to requirements for new organizations to reach funding?
- Chairman Brown: If new organizations have 10 or more members, then they can come straight to the committee to earn funding, and not wait for their overarching organizations.
- Minority Party Leader Grabowski: What strategy will you have to educate organizations that might not be in the loop of funding?
- Chairman Brown: This is our committee's as well as senators' responsibilities to be reaching out to constituents about this change in funding.
- Senator Portugues: Can you mention some of the changes in funding caps?
- Chairman Brown: An organization can request for \$5,000 max per event, and \$20,000 per semester. Clothing must not exceed \$15 per item, and \$15,000 per fiscal year for speakers. Food has increased from \$3 to \$5 per head.

First round of con:

- Minority Party Leader Grabowski: The biggest problem is the events cap, and taking away this liberty is something that we cannot allow.
- Senator Amrose: Reiterates Minority Party Leader Grabowski's comments. There were things, however, that could not be worked out, like lobbying being removed as a funding option. This is a change we cannot support.
- Minority Party Leader Grabowski: The "first come, first serve" idea could go wrong, even if it can be prevented.

First round of pro:

- Senator White: This is a good response to litigation in the past, as organizations can now get their funding on their own time.
- Senator Girschick: Having a better checklist in the codes will result in better understanding by organizations.
- Senator Perez: It is on the senators to make sure we are effectively outreaching.
- Senator Jesurajan: The funding limits will make sure that all organizations have access to additive funding.
- Senator Garner: This legislation allows for more transparency to occur.

Second Round of Con:

- Senator Amrose: Many of those who came for public comment in these meetings were very unhappy with the changes by the Ad-Hoc Committee.
- Senator Ortiz: Has a problem with the \$5 per head food allowance. Also has concerns with the codes being too rigid, which can result in problems. Would like to see how a judicial appeal process would carry out.
- Senator Jackson: There are many organizations that are not under umbrellas.

Second Round of Pro:

- Senator Meyer: As a clerk for the committee, he has seen many of those who made public comments. A good compromise was found for many of the caps. Rewriting
- Senator Wikan: The changes in the language in the 800 Codes is very positive for the student body.

- Senator Greenwald: Being in a Big 9 Umbrella Organization, it was very frustrating to receive funding on their own terms, and believes this legislation can help this problem.

Third Round of Con:

- Senator Jackson: Is afraid of non-umbrella organizations having problems securing funding when not being supported by large organizations.
- Minority Party Grabowski: Highlights that lobbying should be considered to convey students' voice.
- Senator Lima: We would have benefitted from an increase in inclusivity, like the meetings being better marketed. A better marketing strategy could be benefit.

Third Round of Pro:

- Senator Perez: The increase of other caps can compensate for the events cap.
- Senator Glover: As a founder of new organizations, these changes will allow for new organizations to flourish. Notes the change of requiring 10 members for organizations, instead of 20.
- Senator Garner: As a member of the CALS College Council, notes the involvement of Chairman Brown with engaging with many organizations.

Final Round of Con:

- Senator Lima: Notes that the student body was not given fair warning for the commencement of these meetings. Attendance being weak was very discouraging. This is a learning experience.
- Senator Amrose: There are still many problems after the amendments being adopted. Points to a specific point in the revision for proof.

Final Round of Pro:

- Senator Portuguese: Notes that organizations can read the codes to understand things, as they are far clearer and easier to understand.
- Senator Wikan: Being on in an SG funded organization, can attest to the tremendous change that comes with this legislation.

Final Privilege:

- Organizations can reach out to the Budget Committee at any time.
- Would thank the members of the 800 Code Revisions Ad-Hoc Committee.
- Looks forward to the vote.

In a standing vote of 49 to 7, that motion passes.

Student Senate Bill 2019-1061:

Chairman Brown moves to call the previous question by unanimous consent. Approved.

Chairman Brown moves to approve Student Senate Bill 2019-1061 by unanimous consent.

REPLACEMENT AND AGENDA COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

Majority Party Leader Pearson moves to hear all Replacement and Agenda Committee Recommendations as a block.

Point of order. Minority Party Leader Grabowski claims that special rules can only be implemented by the Replacement and Agenda Committee.

Senate President Shaw rules that the last page of the Senate Rules and Procedures states that senators can make these rulings, so long as it is not explicitly stated that one cannot in the Senate Rules and Procedures.

Majority Party Leader Pearson moves to hear all Replacement and Agenda Committee Recommendations as a block. In a roll call vote of 43 to 15. That motion passes.
Senate President Shaw rescinds this motion.

Senator Pearson moves to suspend Rule XI of the Student Senate Rules and Procedures.
Senator Pearson rescinds that motion.

Senator Pearson moves for a 15 minute recess. In the eyes of the chair. That motion passes.
