**TITLE: Resolution Denouncing Digital Racism and Demanding Accountability**

**WHEREAS**, according to UF regulation, “In the admission of students, the University may consider an applicant’s character”<sup>1</sup>; and,

**WHEREAS**, if character may be used as a basis for admitting a student, then character may be used as a basis for rescinding a student’s admission; and,

**WHEREAS**, on June 3, 2020, it was revealed that Liberty Woodley who had been accepted to the UF Class of 2024 had published an Instagram post<sup>2</sup> degrading two of her black classmates by making racist comments; and,

**WHEREAS**, according to an official statement from the University of Florida, the language used in the post was “disturbing, offensive and deeply troubling”<sup>2</sup> ; and,

**WHEREAS**, the University of Florida’s Gainesville campus has a documented and repeated history of racially motivated hate crimes within the past 5 years<sup>3</sup>; and,

**WHEREAS**, the University of Florida honor pledge demands we “hold ourselves and our peers to the highest standards of honesty and integrity”<sup>4</sup>; then,

**THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED** that the University of Florida Student Senate recognizes this post as heinous, threatening and antithetical to the values of the University of Florida.

**THEREFORE, LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED** that the University of Florida Student Senate requests that the University Administration include a strict zero tolerance policy for bigotry and hate speech on the University’s application portal and application homepage.

**THEREFORE, LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED** that the University of Florida Student Senate recognizes this post as a stark violation of the integrity clause designated within the University of Florida Student Honor Pledge, and therefore the University of Florida Student Honor Code.

**THEREFORE, LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED** that the University of Florida Student Senate formally implores the Administration to rescind the perpetrator's admission to the University.

**THEREFORE, LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED** that the University of Florida Student Senate recognizes that Liberty Woodley's post and posts of its nature constitutes an offense against the student body defined in the University of Florida Student Body Constitution.

**THEREFORE, LET IT FINALLY BE RESOLVED** that the University of Florida Student Senate shall refer future perpetrators to the UF Student Conduct and Conflict Resolution office for charges on the aforementioned offense against the student body and for violations of the UF Student Honor Pledge.
