 - Senator Utt holds a presentation on the Resolution to impeach Ryan Wiele, Chair of the Elections Commission, for abusing his office to suppress the voting rights of the Student Body.

- Minority Party Leader Seaberg:
 - Appreciated Senator Trejos' Powerpoint.
 - However, this undermines the democratic process of debating in person.
 - \circ $\;$ The whole point is to debate and ask questions.
 - Next week is SG elections.
 - These elections will determine half the senate body.
 - Yet, there is no early voting.
 - This is exposing countless poll workers as well as students.

- Students are only able to vote via mail or in person.
- $\circ~$ We should not aid the spread of COVID-19.
- Senator Lea:
 - Introduces herself.
 - Senator related to the Inspire party and is not slating this semester.
 - Wants to speak on Senator Utt's resolution.
 - Early voting has been terminated and on campus locations are cut in half.
 - This poses an incredible public health concern.
 - Cannot guarantee social distancing.
 - Low voter turnout is a result of voter suppression.
 - \circ $\,$ In the fall when online voting was protested, we were denied.
 - The reasoning provided was that SG elections wanted to apply to federal voting rules as much as possible.
 - Where have the standards from the fall gone?
 - Explicitly stated that not including online voting would be detrimental to addressing COVID safety concerns.
 - The national press has addressed UF lack of safety by its administration.
 - We have not taken COVID seriously as students.
 - I wonder if anyone cares. We have all made sacrifices to play our part in stopping the spread of the pandemic.
 - Why isn't the chair of elections doing the same?
