762.11	The collection of "I Voted" stickers, and other forms of vote accounting,
<u>shall be</u>	
	legal when they do not infringe on a voter's ability to waive their right to vote.
	Campus organizations may reward voters for participating in elections. However,
	they may not punish students for not participating in elections.
762.12	The distribution of "I Voted" stickers by anyone outside of election staff shall be
	considered voter suppression. Should an accusation of voter suppression of this
	nature arise, it shall be addressed by the Elections Commission within their set
	procedure and the Supreme Court if outside of previously stated procedures.
	Those found guilty of voter suppression shall be barred from running for Student
	Government office for one year.
