Describe what happened (be specific – include time and dates):

Impact-affiliated Study Body President Ian Green wrote a letter to the editor to University of Florida campus news outlet The Independent Florida Alligator. Attached with this complaint are screen captures of the letter the Alligator published on Feb 10, 2019. In his letter, President Green misrepresents material facts in the following quote:

"Specifically, the legislative branch does not have the constitutional authority to make rules and codes that the executive branch has to follow, no matter how noble the intentions."

This is a flagrant misrepresentation of UF Student Body Constitution Articles III & IV.

- The legislative branch has the sole right to enact laws, pursuant to Article III, Section 6(m).
- Article IV, Section 2(b) dictates that the executive branch shall take that Student Body law is faithfully executed.
- The combination of these two constitutional provisions necessitate that the legislative branch has
 the constitutional authority to make rules and codes that the executive branch has to follow.
- Hence, President Green's statement in (1) is a direct contradiction to these principles and is an unmistakable instance of misrepresentation of material fact.
- 762.11 states that "No candidate or representative of a political party shall misrepresent any material fact in campaign material or in campaigning in any form."
- Hence, President Green is in violation of Code 762.11.

Letter to the Editor: The Miseducation of Zachariah Chou

Hey Gators! As election day at UF gets closer and closer, there is always a certain amount of negative campaigning that takes place before students vote. With that said, Zachariah Chou's mischaracterization of his record and criticisms of Student Government go a step too far.

On a website published by the Inspire Party this past Tuesday, Chou claims that SG delayed implementing live-streaming of Student Senate meetings in order to avoid transparency with the student body. This claim could not be further from the truth. SG and the Impact Party have worked with SG Information Technology for the better part of a year creating a live-streaming website and platform for students at UF to view Senate meetings. We even began the procurement process for a permanently installed ceiling camera, as well as front-facing monitors for use during meetings. Ultimately, this will be a much less awkward implementation of Senate live-streaming than Chou's current process on Facebook Live.

Inspire campaign material goes on to criticize the past Impact Student Body President for vetoing legislation that "will make your jaw drop." Here, Inspire is, in fact, correct that the predecessor vetoed the "Student Body Accessibility Act," which would have required the executive branch to

include closed captioning on all SG videos. What they failed to mention, however, was his reasoning for doing so — Inspire drafted an unconstitutional bill. Specifically, the legislative branch does not have the constitutional authority to make rules and codes that the executive branch has to follow, no matter how noble the intentions. Beyond that, inspire failed to mention that we as the executive branch were already including closed captioning as well as transcripts on our videos, and continues to do so to this day under my administration.

Finally, Chou claims that he and his party are responsible for more street lighting around Infinity Hall and 24/7 operating hours at Library West. Again, while his party is a strong supporter of these resources, they mislead students on their involvement. The project for increased street lighting around Infinity Hall began when Student Body President Susan Webster organized a nighttime lighting tour of the area surrounding Infinity Hall. Webster picked up the Mayor of Gainesville, UF Chief Operating Officer Charlie Lane, and UPD Chief Stumpf in a GOTCHA car, and drove around the residence hall with a light gauge, showing just how dark the streets got at night. As a result of this project, we now have the new lights you see today.

As for Library West, UF could always use more study space on campus as we strive to be a top five public institution, but I disagree with Senator Chou on how we should get there. Chou demanded that we raise your student fees to fund this priority, but with a little time and by fostering positive relationships with Provost Joseph Glover and other administrators, I was able to expand 24/7 library hours for three years without raising student fees even by one cent. This represents a primary difference between the leadership of impact and the leadership of inspire, and I can say with confidence that Chou's online petitions actually made my decisions with administrators more difficult as the petition was inaccurate and misleading.

When I took office, I swore to be a Student Body President to all Gators, including SG officers who aren't affiliated with my party. I have met with countless students and Inspire senators who have reached out to me or have come to my office hours. In fact, those inspire senators that met with me led to supported legislation on making UF more sustainable and the funding of a blue light pole system by Graham Hall. On the other hand, Chou has only met with me to mostly say that I was wrong and his short-term Library West fix was better than my long-term strategy. In retrospect, I wish that Chou would have been more of a collaborator during my term like other Senators, instead of trying to cherry pick on the over 40 initiatives my administration has been able to accomplish for the student body.

Looking to the future, I hope that all Gators currently running to serve the student body will campaign with respect and honesty. Even in the heat of an upcoming election, our students deserve better.

At around 12:50:00 PM on 2/19/2019, Impact Party affiliated Senator Katie Hernandez posted the attached Facebook post. This post includes a graphic showing Hernandez and several others in Impact Party campaign shirts standing with Impact Party Treasurer candidate Santiago Gutierrez, accompanied by text stating "GO VOTE! Santiago". The graphic is accompanied by text in the post's caption stating "Come out and vote for Santiago Gutierrez!". This post does not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections.

§700.4(f) states ""Campaign Material" means any print or electronic material used for the purpose of supporting a candidate or political party for an elective Student Body office, an initiative, a referendum question or proposed constitutional amendment. "Campaign material" shall include, but not be limited to, fliers, banners, posters, placards, electronic mail internet posts, and clothing."

§762.0 states "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections. The phrase shall be followed by the name of the individual who authorized the creation of, disbursement of, or payment for, a piece of campaign material. In addition, all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Procedures for distribution and posting of campaign material not provided for by the Student Government Election Code may be established by the Supervisor of Elections or by the Elections Commission. However, such procedures shall not be inconsistent with the Student Government Election Code and they shall

not be effective unless presented in writing to the candidates and registered political parties twentyfour (24) hours prior to the time that any such procedures take effect."

This post unambiguously is an electronic material used for the purpose of supporting a candidate or political party for an elective Student Body office, an initiative, a referendum question or proposed constitutional amendment, as it features text posted by a candidate stating "GO VOTE! Santiago" and "Come out and vote for Santiago Gutierrez!".

Because this post is a campaign material which does not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections, its posting by Katie Hernandez constitutes a violation of §762.0's requirement that "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections".

Further, because this post is a campaign material which does not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections, the person filing the complaint alleges that the post was not registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Thus, the post's posting by Katie Hernandez constitutes a violation of §762.0's requirement that "all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution".

This post includes text in the post's caption stating "Hi, I'm Julia Cordover and it is an honor to announce my candidacy for the Freshman Seat in the University of Florida Student Senate with the Impact Party. On February 9th, 2018, I received one of the most impactful messages to this day. I was accepted into my dream school, The University of Florida. At that moment, I felt a sense of success. At around 3:49:00 PM on 1/25/2019, Impact Party affiliated senator Andrew Goren posted the attached Snapchat post. This post includes a photograph showing Impact presidential candidate Michael Murphy speaking. The photograph is accompanied by text stating "Vote impact". This post does not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections.

§700.4(f) states ""Campaign Material" means any print or electronic material used for the purpose of supporting a candidate or political party for an elective Student Body office, an initiative, a referendum question or proposed constitutional amendment. "Campaign material" shall include, but not be limited to, fliers, banners, posters, placards, electronic mail internet posts, and clothing."


§762.0 states "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections. The phrase shall be followed by the name of the individual who authorized the creation of, disbursement of, or payment for, a piece of campaign material. In addition, all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Procedures for distribution and posting of campaign material not provided for by the Student Government Election Code may be established by the Supervisor of Elections or by the Elections Commission. However, such procedures shall not be inconsistent with the Student Government Election Code and they shall

Because this post is a campaign material which does not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections, its posting by Andrew Goren constitutes a violation of §762.0's requirement that "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections".

Further, because this post is a campaign material which does not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections, the person filing the complaint alleges that the post was not registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Thus, the post's posting by Andrew Goren constitutes a violation of §762.0's requirement that "all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution".



Describe what happened (be specific – include time and dates):

Impact-affiliated Study Body President Ian Green wrote a letter to the editor to University of Florida campus news outlet The Independent Florida Alligator. Attached with this complaint are screen captures of the letter the Alligator published on Feb 10, 2019. In his letter, President Green misrepresents material facts about Presidential Candidate Zachariah Chou, in the following quote:

(2) "Chou claims that he and his party are responsible for more street lighting around Infinity Hall and 24/7 operating hours at Library West."

This is a misrepresentation of Mr. Chou's position and previous statements.

- "Chou" -- in reference to Mr. Chou-- has never made a claim that President Green describes Mr. Chou as making in (2).
- The only known relevant statements to (2) are located on the Inspire Party website which affirms
 Chou "served as a ferocious and successful advocate for causes such...streetlights outside
 Infinity Hall", not that he is responsible for the streetlights.
- Additionally, this website says Inspire "Inspire Party also launched a petition and successfully advocated to fund a real 24/7 library with access to textbooks and computer", not that it is responsible for the 24/7 operating hours.
- 762.11 states that "No candidate or representative of a political party shall misrepresent any material fact in campaign material or in campaigning in any form."
- Hence, President Green's statement, "Chou claims that he and his party are responsible for more street lighting around Infinity Hall and 24/7 operating hours at Library West" misrepresents Mr. Chou's position, and claims Mr. Green has violated 762.11.

Hey Gators! As election day at UF gets closer and closer, there is always a certain amount of negative campaigning that takes place before students vote. With that said, Zachariah Chou's mischaracterization of his record and criticisms of Student Government go a step too far.

On a website published by the inspire Party this past Tuesday, Chou claims that SG delayed implementing live-streaming of Student Senate meetings in order to avoid transparency with the student body. This claim could not be further from the truth. SG and the Impact Party have worked with SG Information Technology for the better part of a year creating a live-streaming website and platform for students at UF to view Senate meetings. We even began the procurement process for a permanently installed ceiling camera, as well as front-facing monitors for use during meetings. Ultimately, this will be a much less awkward implementation of Senate live-streaming than Chou's current process on Facebook Live.

Inspire campaign material goes on to criticize the past Impact Student Body President for vetoing legislation that "will make your jaw drop." Here, Inspire is, in fact, correct that the predecessor vetoed the "Student Body Accessibility Act," which would have required the executive branch to

include closed captioning on all SG videos. What they failed to mention, however, was his reasoning for doing so — Inspire drafted an unconstitutional bill. Specifically, the legislative branch does not have the constitutional authority to make rules and codes that the executive branch has to follow, no matter how noble the intentions. Beyond that, Inspire failed to mention that we as the executive branch were already including closed captioning as well as transcripts on our videos, and continues to do so to this day under my administration.

Finally, Chou claims that he and his party are responsible for more street lighting around Infinity Hall and 24/7 operating hours at Library West. Again, while his party is a strong supporter of these resources, they mislead students on their involvement. The project for increased street lighting around Infinity Hall began when Student Body President Susan Webster organized a nighttime lighting tour of the area surrounding Infinity Hall. Webster picked up the Mayor of Gainesville, UF Chief Operating Officer Charlie Lane, and UPD Chief Stumpf in a GOTCHA car, and drove around the residence hall with a light gauge, showing just how dark the streets got at night. As a result of this project, we now have the new lights you see today.

As for Library West, UF could always use more study space on campus as we strive to be a top five public institution, but I disagree with Senator Chou on how we should get there. Chou demanded that we raise your student fees to fund this priority, but with a little time and by fostering positive relationships with Provost Joseph Glover and other administrators, I was able to expand 24/7 library hours for three years without raising student fees even by one cent. This represents a primary difference between the leadership of Impact and the leadership of Inspire, and I can say with confidence that Chou's online petitions actually made my decisions with administrators more difficult as the petition was inaccurate and misleading.

When I took office, I swore to be a Student Body President to all Gators, including SG officers who aren't affiliated with my party. I have met with countless students and inspire senators who have reached out to me or have come to my office hours. In fact, those inspire senators that met with me led to supported legislation on making UF more sustainable and the funding of a blue light pole system by Graham Hall. On the other hand, Chou has only met with me to mostly say that I was wrong and his short-term Library West fix was better than my long-term strategy. In retrospect, I wish that Chou would have been more of a collaborator during my term like other Senators, instead of trying to cherry pick on the over 40 initiatives my administration has been able to accomplish for the student body.

Looking to the future, I hope that all Gators currently running to serve the student body will campaign with respect and honesty. Even in the heat of an upcoming election, our students deserve better.





At around 7:35:00 PM on 2/20/2019, an unknown Impact Party affiliated canvasser clad in an Impact Party campaign shirt was recorded campaigning with a student nearby in the below linked video. This linked video shows the Impact Party affiliated canvasser visibly speaking with the student about the Student Government elections in an attempt to get the student to vote for Impact Party. Critically, the interaction takes place in its entirety, clearly, as recorded within 50 feet of the door of a voting location, the Marston Science Library.

Indeed, many Impact Party affiliated canvassers were seen engaging in the same behavior within 50 feet of the door to the Marston Science Library.

§763.5 states that "No campaigning shall take place within fifty (50) feet of the door of any polling location or within 50 feet of any queue of voters defined in 700.4 (z) waiting to vote, with the exception of the designated outdoor tabling space at the J. Wayne Reitz Union."

This video unambiguously shows a flagrant disregard for §763.5's restrictions on campaigning within 50 feet of the door of any polling location, as the linked video clearly shows the Impact Party affiliated canvasser visibly speaking with the student about the Student Government elections in an attempt to get the student to vote for Impact Party within 50 feet of the door of any polling location.

Because this video unambiguously shows a flagrant disregard for §763.5's restrictions on campaigning within 50 feet of the door of any polling location, as the linked video clearly shows the Impact Party affiliated canvasser visibly speaking with the student about the Student Government elections in an attempt to get the student to vote for Impact Party within 50 feet of the door of any polling location, the depicted Impact Party affiliated canvasser has clearly committed a violation of §763.5's requirement that "No campaigning shall take place within fifty (50) feet of the door of any polling location or within 50 feet of any queue of voters defined in 700.4 (z) waiting to vote, with the exception of the designated outdoor tabling space at the J. Wayne Reitz Union".





The University Information Technology Department has established a "Spam Policy" to target "sources of unwanted, unsolicited email (spam) external to the UF Network." In the policy, it states: "Spam sent to University of Florida accounts is unacceptable and violates the terms of acceptable use of the University of Florida IT resources."

To ensure political parties comply with university email regulations, Student Government established Student Body Statute 764.0. The Student Body Statutes require all candidates and parties to comply with university email usage regulations as promulgated in the acceptable use policy, which includes the University of Florida "Spam Policy."

On September 23, 2019, the Inspire Party sent an email with the subject "Tomorrow at UF!" to an undisclosed number of receipts. In the email, Inspire Party encourages students to vote for Inspire Party in the Student Government elections on September 24th and 25th.

The email was sent to multiple students who did not consent to their email being released and used for this purpose. The email that was received is an unwanted, unsolicited email that meets the definition of spam as established by university policy. The email thus is considered a violation of university regulations and a violation of Student Body Statute 764.0.

Attached to this complaint is more than 15 copies of the email received by multiple students as highlighted on each document. In addition, the University of Florida "Spam Policy" is attached.

Based on the evidence established above, we are requesting the Chair of the Elections Commission to issue a preliminary order that Inspire Party cease and desist from the distribution of campaign material as allowed by Student Body Statute 723.4. We believe this complaint establishes a preponderance of evidence that leads to a conclusion that there is a strong likelihood of a violation and the material is so offensive that it may irreparably harm other offended parties.

After the first occurrence, an attempt will be made to notify the sender that unsolicited email should not be sent to university accounts and that any further receipt of such messages will initiate our procedures to block email from the sender.

After the second occurrence, the system will be configured to block email coming from the offending account. Any reinstatement of privileges must be requested in writing from the UF ISM

On August 29, 2019, at approximately 8:00am, the Gator Party table outside of the Student Government elections qualifying and slating rooms was left unattended. This is a violation of a Student Activities and Involvement regulation which states that "No leaving stacks of materials unattended on university grounds". The table clearly displayed the "Gator Party" banner, which qualifies as "Campaign Material" per §700.4(f). Additionally, as there was no one at the table at the time, it was left unattended. This is a violation of 746.0.

§700.4(f) states "(f) "Campaign Material" means any print or electronic material used for the purpose of supporting a candidate or political party for an elective Student Body office, an initiative, a referendum question or proposed constitutional amendment. "Campaign material" shall include, but not be limited to, fliers, banners, posters, placards, electronic mail internet posts, and clothing"

§746.0 states that "All political parties must comply with all rules and regulations governing student organizations set forth by the Department of Student Activities and Involvement."

On August 31st, 2019, at approximately 1:21 PM, Gator Party member Audrey Wikan maintained a "story" on Instagram including a photo of Gators Party members and the text "these are my people!!!" and "@gatorpartyuf". The photo is campaign material per §700.4(f), as it contains imagery of Gator Party members Emily Dunson, Wynton White, and Richard Doan and clearly demonstrates an association with Gator Party that is supportive in nature. Additionally demonstrating that this is campaign material is the fact that the photo included in this material was also posted on the Gator Party Instagram account and Facebook page. The photo did not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections, as required by §762.0. Therefore, a violation of §762.0 occurred.

§762.0 states "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections. The phrase shall be followed by the name of the individual who authorized the creation of, disbursement of, or payment for, a piece of campaign material. In addition, all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Procedures for distribution and posting of campaign material not provided for by the Student Government Election Code may be established by the Supervisor of Elections or by the Elections Commission. However, such procedures shall not be inconsistent with the Student Government Election Code and they shall not be effective unless presented in writing to the candidates and registered political parties twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time that any such procedures take effect."

Therefore, a violation of §762.0 occurred.

§762.0 states "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections. The phrase shall be followed by the name of the individual who authorized the creation of, disbursement of, or payment for, a piece of campaign material. Describe what happened (be specific - include time and dates):

On August 31st, 2019, at approximately 12:30 PM, Gator Party member Kaylin Bailey maintained a "story" on Instagram that included Gator Party campaign material, including the text "@gatorpartyuf" that clearly identified the content as associated with the party. The photo is campaign material per §700.4(f), as it contains imagery of Gator Party members, including Emily Dunson, Wynton White, and Richard Doan. The campaign material had previously been posted on the Gator Party Instagram account and the Gator Party Facebook account, further demonstrating that Bailey's post was in fact campaign material. The photo did not include the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections, as required by §762.0. Therefore, a violation of §762.0 occurred.

§762.0 states "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections. The phrase shall be followed by the name of the individual who authorized the creation of, disbursement of, or payment for, a piece of campaign material. In addition, all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Procedures for distribution and posting of campaign material not provided for by the Student Government Election Code may be established by the Supervisor of Elections or by the Elections Commission. However, such procedures shall not be inconsistent with the Student Government Election Code and they shall not be effective unless presented in writing to the candidates and registered political parties twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time that any such procedures take effect."

§700.4(f) states "(f) "Campaign Material" means any print or electronic material used for the purpose of supporting a candidate or political party for an elective Student Body office, an initiative, a referendum question or proposed constitutional amendment. "Campaign material" shall include, but not be limited to, fliers, banners, posters, placards, electronic mail internet posts, and clothing"





Therefore, a violation of §765.1 occurred.

§765.1 states, in full, "Campaign materials accompanying tables permitted pursuant to 765.0 may include a banner not to exceed 4' X 4'. Any banner under this section may be displayed in a manner that the total height does not exceed 12'. The supporting mechanism for such banner may not exceed 2" X 2" in girth. Campaign materials may be displayed on or around any table permitted pursuant to 765.0 in any manner subject to University guidelines and the other provisions of this chapter."

§700.4(f) states "(f) "Campaign Material" means any print or electronic material used for the purpose of supporting a candidate or political party for an elective Student Body office, an initiative, a referendum question or proposed constitutional amendment. "Campaign material" shall include, but not be limited to, fliers, banners, posters, placards, electronic mail internet posts, and clothing".

Describe what happened (be specific - include time and dates):

On September 19th, 2019, at approximately 2:50 PM, Gator Party member Nick Meyer maintained campaign material on Instagram that was not registered with the Supervisor of Elections or their Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution.

Specifically, the post showed the Gator Party platform and included the text "Check out the full platform!". The post is campaign material per §700.4(f), as it contains imagery of Gator Party materials, text of their platform, and is supportive of Gator Party. Therefore, a violation of §762.0 occurred.

§762.0 states "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections. The phrase shall be followed by the name of the individual who authorized the creation of, disbursement of, or payment for, a piece of campaign material. In addition, all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Procedures for distribution and posting of campaign material not provided for by the Student Government Election Code may be established by the Supervisor of Elections or by the Elections Commission. However, such procedures shall not be inconsistent with the Student Government Election Code and they shall not be effective unless presented in writing to the candidates and registered political parties twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time that any such procedures take effect."

§700.4(f) states "(f) "Campaign Material" means any print or electronic material used for the purpose of supporting a candidate or political party for an elective Student Body office, an initiative, a referendum question or proposed constitutional amendment. "Campaign material" shall include, but not be limited to, fliers, banners, posters, placards, electronic mail internet posts, and clothing"



Elections Commission Chair Kyle Soch called the hearing to order at 6:00 pm.

Members Present: Kyle Soch, Katharine Haddad, Amanda Matyk, Noah Liebling, and Austin Klein

Members Absent: Alexis Castro

The Commission first considered Complaint F19-002. The Commission heard an opening statement from the Plaintiff and Defendant, a presentation of the complaint by the Plaintiff, a rebuttal by the Defendant, and a closing statement by both the Plaintiff and Defendant. The Commission then voted in favor of finding a violation during public consideration. The Commission then heard the Plaintiff, then the Defendant present statements on an appropriate penalty. After public consideration, the Commission found a \$5 penalty as an appropriate penalty. 6:19 pm.

Next, the Commission considered Complaint F19-003. On September 20th, 2019, at approximately 7:39 PM, Gator Party candidate Andrew Goren maintained and had posted campaign material on Facebook that was not labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections.

The post is campaign material per §700.4(f), as it contains supportive descriptions of Gator Party and Goren's candidacy. Therefore, a violation of §762.0 occurred.

§762.0 states "Candidates shall ensure that all "campaign material" as defined in Section 700.4(f) shall be labeled with the phrase "Registered Political Advertisement" or a phrase of similar import approved by the Supervisor of Elections. The phrase shall be followed by the name of the individual who authorized the creation of, disbursement of, or payment for, a piece of campaign material. In addition, all campaign material must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections or his or her Assistant Supervisors of Elections prior to the time of distribution. Procedures for distribution and posting of campaign material not provided for by the Student Government Election Code may be established by the Supervisor of Elections or by the Elections Commission. However, such procedures shall not be inconsistent with the Student Government Election Code and they shall not be effective unless presented in writing to the candidates and registered political parties twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time that any such procedures take effect."
