STUDENT SENATE BILL 2024-1189

TITLE: Resolution Advocating for the Addition of a Proper On-Campus Battery & Electronic Waste Collection Location

WHEREAS, according to the World Health Organization, electronic waste (e-waste) can pollute the air, soil, and water by releasing dangerous chemicals into the environment, posing a considerable risk to human health not limited to cancer and neurological damage [1]; and,

WHEREAS, many of the batteries used in common electronic devices employed by University of Florida students contain toxic heavy metals such as mercury, lead, lithium, cadmium, and nickel metal hydride [1][2]; and,

WHEREAS, according to estimates from the US Environmental Protection Agency, 60% of discarded electronics wind up in the trash [3]; and,

WHEREAS, the University of Florida Facilities Services currently has a goal to "divert 90% of UF Waste from landfills" [4]; and,

WHEREAS, the University of Florida recognizes non-alkaline batteries as "Universal Waste" not meant to be disposed of in regular waste disposal bins [5]; and,

WHEREAS, the current e-waste collection sites - HUB and UF Surplus - do not accept chargers, used batteries, smartwatches, or household appliances commonly found in college dormitories (microwaves, fans, etc) [6]; and,

WHEREAS, the University of Florida Facilities Services current recycling guide requires special handling of batteries by Environmental Health & Safety that provides an added burden to students attempting to properly dispose of them [7]; and,

WHEREAS, the closest location to properly dispose of the previously mentioned e-waste off-campus is the Alachua County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center which is seven miles away from the University of Florida campus [8] and only realistically accessible via a car [9]; and,

WHEREAS, short-term battery recycling drives fail to address the ongoing need for a permanent on-campus battery recycling location to allow students to dispose of used batteries at any point in time [2]; and,

WHEREAS, the University of Florida's on-campus battery recycling options are deficient resulting in improperly-disposed environmentally toxic battery materials leaking into the University's soil [10]; and,

WHEREAS, peer institutions such as Florida International University currently implement oncampus electronic waste/battery recycling disposal containers in on-campus residence halls [11]; and,

WHEREAS, the University of Florida's Six Core Values include Stewardship aimed at "[leaving] a just and habitable world for those who come after us" [12]; then,

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the University of Florida Student Senate recognizes the importance of sustainability and access to proper waste disposal services; and,

THEREFORE, LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED the University of Florida Student Senate recognizes the need for a comprehensive on-campus e-waste & battery disposal system to be put in place; and,

THEREFORE, LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED that the University of Florida Student Senate recognizes University of Florida Surplus team has made efforts for sustainability but they could be further improved; and,

THEREFORE, LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED that the University of Florida Student Senate calls for the addition of an e-waste collection location that accepts all forms of e-waste in the Reitz Union at the UF Bookstore; and,

THEREFORE, LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the University of Florida Student Senate calls for the implementation of similar e-waste collection locations at other convenient on-campus locations such as Residence Halls and the Reitz Union; and

THEREFORE, LET IT FINALLY BE RESOLVED THAT the University of Florida Student Senate calls for collaboration between the UF Housing Department, UF Surplus, Facilities Services, and Environmental Health & Safety to implement the aforementioned battery recycling system.
