TITLE: Election Visibility Act

CHAPTER 710 – THE SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS ACT (2000-141, 2002-144, 2004-116, 2005-137, 2005-138, 2006-103, 2006-108, Spring 2006 Ballot Initiative, 2006-113, 2006-117, 2006-123, 2006-129, 2007-109, 2009-100 2009-102, 2009-103, 2010-100, 2010-111, 2011-115, 2012-101, 2012-107, 2013-102, 2014-119, 2016-104, 2017-113, 2018-124, 2019-103, 2020-1024, 2020-1043, 2021-109)

- The Supervisor of Elections shall draft a social media post to inform every elector of their right to request and vote by an absentee ballot and encourage them to exercise this right if voting in person will be inconvenient for them. The Supervisor of Elections shall draft at least two three such social media posts, with at least one social media post sent to the Action SG Chairperson for posting between nine (9) and ten (10) business days before the electronic form submission deadline, at least one social media post sent to the Action SG Chairperson for posting between five (5) and six (6) business days before the electronic form submission deadline, and at least one social media post sent to the Action SG Chairperson for posting between two one (1) and three two (2) business days before the deadline. Each such post must be sent to the Action SG Chairperson between 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. Additionally, the posts shall include the following:
 - (a) A direct link to the electronic form mandated in Section 714.2, S.B.S.
 - (b) The date and time by which the electronic form must be submitted for the request to be processed.

Proviso: This bill of law shall take effect for the Fall 2024 general election.
