STUDENT SENATE BILL 2024-1718

TITLE: Graduate, Union, and Institutional Development Enhancement (GUIDE): Section 1, Volume III: UF Unions

WHEREAS, Graduate Assistants United under the United Faculty of Florida (GAU) as well as the United Faculty of Florida at the University of Florida (UFF-UF) are the recognized bargaining units of the graduate employees and the faculty at UF [1-2]; and,

WHEREAS, United Campus Workers UF(UCW) represent the staff and adjunct employees throughout the university, and are currently working to organize as a recognized union [3]; and,

WHEREAS, GAU has represented the collective interests of graduate assistants throughout UF campuses since 1972; and,

WHEREAS, GAU must bargain an improved collective bargaining agreement (CBA) every three years, with the current negotiations occurring since September 9th, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, higher benefits has been established to correlate with higher productivity and lower turnover [4-5]; and,

WHEREAS, since its founding, GAU victories have included paid leave, the establishment and raising of stipends, tuition waivers, healthcare insurance, protections about appointments and reappointments, enhanced non-discrimination language, and protections for academic freedom [2]; and,

WHEREAS, GAU is currently bargaining towards instituting a living wage, increasing healthcare protections, addressing overwork, fighting discrimination, and lowering rent burdens; and [2]; and,

WHEREAS, Instituting a living wage and GAU's other demands will have a broad positive impact on the campus community as a whole [4-5]; and,

WHEREAS, the state of Florida in 2023 passed HB256, which raised barriers for public bargaining units, and placed unions across the state "in a panic" [6,12]; and,

WHEREAS, academic freedom is protected by both Article 9 of GAU's CBA and Article 10 of UFF's CBA, creating an inherent tie between the fight for academic freedom and the higher education labor movement in Florida [1-2]; then,

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the University of Florida Student Senate supports the continued existence of GAU and UFF-UF; and,

THEREFORE, LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the University of Florida Student Senate supports the above listed unionization efforts of UCW; and,

THEREFORE, LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the University of Florida Student Senate supports the above listed current endeavors of employees exercising their collective rights.
